A Bill for an Act Entitled: The American Decency Act of 2014

In the House

RESOLVED by the U.S. House of Representatives of the United States of America, that the following article is proposed as federal law under the jurisdiction of the United States of America, enforceable by Executive action.

BE it enacted by the House of Representatives and by the Senate of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that:

Section 1. The National Football League, Major League Baseball, the National Basketball Association and the National Hockey League and all teams thereof shall hereby be prohibited from employing players who are homosexual. This provision shall apply only in cases where a player has openly declared himself to be a homosexual.

Section 2. The prohibition contained in Section 1 above shall not apply to any team that provides facilities for homosexual players that are separate and distinct from those facilities for other players. The Commissioner of the National Football League, the Commissioner of Major League Baseball, the Commissioner of the National Basketball Association and the Commissioner of the National Hockey League shall determine whether facilities constitute separate and distinct.

Section 3. The provisions contained in Sections 1 and 2 above shall pre-empt all state law.

Section 4. The US Department of Justice shall have the power to enforce this legislation by all

Section 5. Should one part of this legislation be deemed at any point unconstitutional, all other parts shall be considered separate and entirely severable for Federal Constitutional purposes.

Section 6. Each violation of (A) and (B) above shall result in a fine of not less than \$8 million not more than \$13 million.
